

"When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another." These words plant the seeds of freedom. This Declaration of Independence further states, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."



MORE THAN DOLLARS IN THE SAND By Kethleen Ruckman

For nothing is secret that will not be revealed, nor anything hidden that will not be known and come to light. ~Luke 8:17 (NKIV)

Most sand dollars live in the waters along the coasts of Africa, Singapore, Indonesia, and the Bahamas. But I am privileged to walk among them on the Oregon coast, too. I dare not touch the fuzzy purple ones, for they are alive. But whenever I find one bleached from the sun, I know the sea urchin has died and left its habitat. As I gently pick it up, it seems almost holy in my hand.

Sand dollars are a species of flat, burrowing sea urchins with spines much shorter and softer than those of the typical sea urchin, giving them a velvety look. I am inspired by its deep-purple color. The petallike pattern on its back comes from perforations where its tube feet project. The tube feet help the creature breathe, and its spines help it move and capture plankton for food. Every detail holds a purpose in this treasure from the sea.

Christians have likened the sand dollar to a symbol of God. On the outer skeleton, there are five holes that can represent the five wounds of Christ. At the center is the outline of an Easter lily, and at the lily's heart, the star of Bethlehem. The etching of what resembles a poinsettia is found on the underside, a reminder of Christmas and Jesus' birth. Many - including me - have found that if they break open the center of the bleached sand dollar, they see five pieces inside shaped like tiny white doves, symbols of the gospel of peace.

These hidden glories are present for me to discover whenever I walk the shore close to home. Just recently, I held this unique treasure in my hand and thanked the One from whom it came - the Lord, my Savior and greatest treasure.


