

CRASH! What was that? My wife and I were startled by a loud noise outside our cabin in the Rocky Mountains. Having recently moved to the area, we were unfamiliar with its night sounds. Bumps in the night are one thing. But this was no ordinary bump!

Following the crash, I quickly grabbed my flashlight and cautiously went to peer our the window of the back door. Thirty inches away were two shining eyes looking directly back at me! This was one of the largest black bears I had ever seen. It was a frightful few seconds, but it rapidly turned into an exciting event, as my wife and I scrambled for our cameras to take pictures and videos of our wonderful, wild, woolly caller. I certainly pose no threat to a very large (and hungry!) bear, but he doesn't know that when I'm hidden behind the powerful electric torch in my hand.

It always amazes me that darkness never overcomes light, but light always overcomes darkness. A tiny candle in a dark room can brighten even the gloomiest corner. Jesus is the light of the world; He is my light, my protector, and my shield. In scary life situations, reading aloud from Psalms calms my fears and illuminates God's truth. I have called on the light of God's Word many times to chase off the "bears in the darkness."


