

THE MEMORY OF ELEPHANTS From All God's Creatures, September/October 2022

Remember the former things, those of long ago; I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me. I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say, "My purpose will stand, and I will do all that I please." ~Isaiah 46:9-10 (NIV)

I was on a safari ride at Disney's Animal Kingdom when I learned that elephants can remember the location of watering holes for years. The guide explained how important water is for the elephants' survival and how this incredible ability to remember past provisions allows the elephants to lead their herds back to those spaces. I find this incredible, because half the time, I can't even remember where I left my water bottle a few hours earlier!

This ability is particularly vital for elephants when facing periods of drought, because they remember not only *one* watering hole but also alternative sources of water. They will choose a different water source, sometimes traveling long distances, if they find their initial choice has dried up.

In the same way, God promises to keep up and to provide for our needs – but sometimes provisions don't sync chronologically with our expectations. I often find myself praying and then expecting an instant answer. While God does sometimes respond just as I have expected, other times, I find I have to actively do two things. First, I have to *remember*, just like the elephants, the places He has sourced provision for me in the past. Doing so not only encourages my spirit but also provides me with direction. Second, I have to *return* to those places. It's not

enough to actively go there. Even during the dry seasons, God still provides for me, but I have to do my part by remembering and returning to all those spaces of provision.

Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go.

It was a video that no mother wants to receive from her eighteen-year-old son: clear footage of a large brown bear outside the window of the cabin he was staying in with a friend's family. Nathan and his friends had seen the bear in the distance while playing basketball and hurried inside before it reached their property. I watched the video again and shuddered. The cabin was a time-share in an upscale mountain resort, hardly a place where one would expect bears.

Still, this bear looked like it was out for an afternoon stroll, not a vicious hunt. I'd received Nathan's video on the same day that a neighbor posted a similar picture from her vacation. So bears were clearly eager to see what kinds of snacks the campers and cabin dwellers had available this summer. I just didn't want one rummaging for goodies near my son.

I'm a single mom, and Nathan is my youngest. He had just graduated from high school. The bear video felt like one more reminder that my days of protecting him from the world were ending. He was a legal adult about to start college. I'd done my best to mold him into a young man of faith and strong character, and now he would experience things that I didn't have a say in. Some of those experiences would include risks, even danger. All I could do was trust his good judgement (starting with the fact that he and his friends had gone inside when they saw the bear) and the heavenly Father who had His eye on Nathan as he launched into adulthood. It motivated me to pray all the harder that he would cling to Jesus through every adventure and challenge.
